My purpose in writing is to Thank You for Loving God & his son Jesus and to tell you and your fellow worshipers An appreciation for the time you guys take to drive and prepare your trips to South Bluff Park on Park St & 538 Tanchua area to give us socks, shoes, blouses, shirts, blankets, bags, and you gave us water when we were thirsty. You truly show your genuine LOVE AND CARE for other people.

Homeless people have a bad reputation but I would like to advocate for the Mentally Ill who have fallen into this category of homeless people. First Baptist Church have also shown so much love for us too. Your kind gestures are surely not overlooked by Jehovah God & Jesus.

Jesus too was a Homeless Man people like City Council Members of Corpes Christi, Tx seem to forget that.

Sorry for my scribble scabble



You put shoes on my bare feet You made me warm with my blanket
You clothed Me when I was naked."

And on the back of the page:
